From the Principal

Marvellous Mallee -

I would also especially like to thank those secondary students who assisted on Friday night with packing up - your efforts were much appreciated.

Alpine School -

Our four Year 9 students have almost completed their term at the Alpine School. Jade, Bram, Darren and Henry presented their Community Learning Project on Friday. Miss Bailey travelled to Dinner Plain to visit the students and view their presentation. She was very impressed by the growth and confidence shown by them all. I know that they have had a fantastic



experience and look forward to seeing them back next term.

Bus review -

As you may be aware our School Bus services have been under review by the Public Transport Victoria (PTV) and the Department for almost the last 12 months. You may have heard that PTV have recommended the termination of Sunset bus and the re-routing of the Boinka run to accommodate these students. I, among others, submitted feedback to this recommendation at the beginning of the year, pointing out that re-routing the bus to the area north-west of Murrayville was preferred to the termination of the service. After speaking to the Director of Student Transport today, it is clear

that this termination will go ahead. It is not clear yet whether these changes will be made for the beginning of Term 3 or may not occur until Term 1 next year. I will keep you posted. Affected families will be notified of changes to routes and timetables well in advance of any changes taking place.

Pinnaroo Bus -

Next term when our students return from Alpine School the big Pinnaroo Bus will be at capacity. Occasional travellers will not be able to assume that they will be able to get a seat. If other students would like to use this

Karen Bailey's report on her visit to the Alpine School ...

Our students at the Alpine School have spent the last 8 weeks learning valuable life skills, completing physical challenges, and working as a team to develop leadership skills. A key component of their time there is the development of a Community Learning Project (CLP). This is a project that they design and organise that will benefit the community in some way. Their initial project had to be changed as it was too costly to be feasible but they were able to brainstorm ideas and develop a new project that will help junior students learn practical skills in a variety of sports. They will explain their CLP in greater detail on their return to school next term. As part of their leadership program they gave a presentation of their CLP to the students and staff at the Alpine School together with visiting Liaison teachers. I attended the CLP day on Friday March 24th at Dinner Plain as our school's Liaison teacher. It was a great opportunity to catch up with our students and hear their proposal. During the session, they make a formal pledge to complete their Project on their return to their home school. All our students have enjoyed their time at the school and have learnt a lot from the experience.



We hope that you have a great term holiday and enjoy the Easter break.




