From the Principal

eSmart Status –

I am very proud to announce that Murrayville Community College is now officially an eSmart school. Since we first registered with the program we have introduced many new policies and procedures to improve the way our school manages cybersafety, bullying and cyberbullying. As a school we feel confident our students, staff and the wider school community are now well supported to be smart, safe and responsible users of digital technology. We encourage everyone in the school community to continue to uphold and promote eSmart behaviours, at school and at home. Unleash learning –

This ongoing professional development has been undertaken by all teaching staff since March. I am now beginning to see, across the school, positive impacts of these strategies that engage all learners and ensure that every student is “lifting the weights” to gain strong understanding and skills. Staff are going the extra mile with their preparation to ensure that every classroom is an engaging and inspiring learning space. They are planning their lessons to maximise learning and minimise disruptions. They are creating opportunities for students to work with partners, to read to each other, to teach each other, to share ideas and understandings, to write summaries of their understandings and notes for future reference. They are posing compelling questions and allowing the students the opportunity to utilise their higher order thinking skills to answer them.

Reports –

Staff are busy preparing the Mid-year reports to parents at the moment and I am busy reading each one. This year we have transitioned to the new Victorian Curriculum for students in Prep to Year 10. The reporting formats have changed only subtly. Likewise, there have only been subtle changes to the curriculum.

Armed and Dangerous – Attacking Addiction –

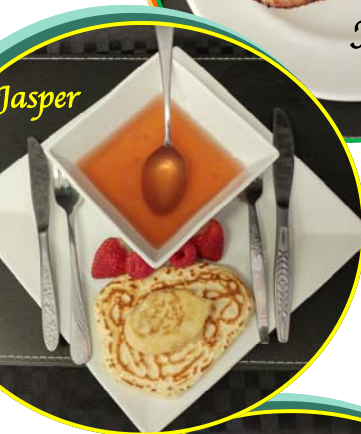
