From the Principal

Duke of Edinburgh Award -

As part of the Advance program we have again enrolled the majority of our Year 9s and 10s in the Duke of Edinburgh Bronze Award. These students will get credit for the sport that they have played and the skills that they have developed outside of school towards this award. Part of the award is providing a service to the community. The 9/10 students enrolled in Advance (Outdoor Ed) have begun to work cooperatively with the Murrayville Walking Trail and Wetland group. They have assisted with rubbish removal, mapping the trails and completed navigation activities. As part of their Personal Development course, the VCAL students involved in Duke of Ed, planned and prepared a BBQ lunch at Pine Hill on Thursday for the other students. Proceeds from the BBQ went to the SRC. Thanks to Mr Watson for his assistance with this.

End of Term -

What a wonderful, busy and productive Term 3 we have had. So many great learning opportunities and extra-curricular experiences have been provided to our students across the whole school. These include: Flinders Uni Test for Year 12s, VCE Studio Art Excursion, English Competition, House and Interschool Athletics, Carly Ryan Foundation visit, Yr 11 & 12 Mock Interviews, Flinders Uni visit to the school and senior students visit to Flinders Uni Open Day, Defence Force visit, WOW program, Arts Council performance – 'The Bottle Collector', 'Ambitions' Social, the Year 3/4 camp to Wellington, Yr 12 Biology trip to Mildura, Yr 12 Maths revision in Robinvale and attendance at the Pinnaroo PS production of 'Twisting Tales'. All of these opportunities are available to our students because our staff and students are prepared to put in the time and effort to make things happen. Term 3 is also the busiest term for our senior students as they work towards their end of year exams, which will almost be upon them on their return to school.

Staffing —

Planning for 2019 is well underway. Students in Years 10 & 11 have submitted their subject choices and I will have access to the indicative budget at the end of this term. With fewer enrolments in 2019 our overall budget will be tighter next year, but I will certainly endeavour to still cater for all of our students' educational needs. Very few staffing decisions have been made at this stage, but I can reveal that Eryn Wyatt will be teaching our early years children and Jaimi Willersdorf and Penny Peers will continue in the middle primary. We will be advertising for upper primary in Term 4. We are currently investigating a primary structure of a P-1 class, a 2/3/4 class and a 5/6 class.

Hats -

Just a reminder to all students and parents that wide-brimmed or bucket hats are required to be worn whilst outside in Term 4 and Term 1. Please ensure that student's hats are brought to school on the first day next term.

Holidays -

I wish everyone a safe and enjoyable holiday away from the routines of school. However, the holidays should provide our students with rich learning experiences and arm them with worldly knowledge that they can draw on at school. If travelling please encourage your children take in the features of a different environment or possibly a different culture. Games like spotto and eye spy can help them to look closely at new places. Trying a new food or cuisine or a local activity may give a better understanding of a local culture. If staying home watching a documentary with your child, encouraging them to read a novel, or do puzzles or board games, cooking together, spending time outdoors, gardening are all ways to provide great learning experiences that will improve their vocabulary, literacy, maths, and provide them with a range of experiences that stimulate ideas when they are discussing and writing.

"It made me feel a lot more confident about myself. It was very helpful and educational."

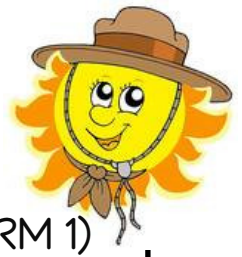

YEAR 9 DEBATING

The Year 9 English class held a debate last week on the student-selected topic: **Illegal immigrants should be deported from Australia without delay.** Both teams, consisting of Annika, Brock and Kynan for the affirmative, and Kristen, Luka and Jaylen for the negative team, presented strong, well substantiated arguments. Jaylen ran the debate as Chairperson and time keeper. He also stepped in to read the third speaker notes for the negative side due to absence of their original team member. Miss Hellwege and Mrs Parker were the adjudicators, and marked students on Matter, Manner and Method. They found that both teams were even in Matter, but the Affirmative side scored slightly higher in Manner and Method, hence they were awarded the winner's trophy.



Here are some of the arguments raised and feedback comments from the Year 7 audience:

"The Affirmative side argued effectively that, 'Why should our tax payers waste their hard-earned money on shelter and detention buildings for illegal immigrants?'"

"They stated that these illegals might bring diseases and that they haven't followed the rules in providing the paperwork or an application, like other refugees."

"The Negative team showed valid reasons why illegal immigrants should have their own rights to choose what is



best for themselves and overall best for their families. Most of the time they are not choosing to be illegal; they are choosing to survive."

"There is a significant risk that boats sent away from our shores will sink and drown these people before they can reach a safe place."

Overall, the Year 9 students learnt a great deal about team management, debating etiquette and how to present a viewpoint clearly and confidently.

Mrs Parker would love to know the origins of the 'debating cup' that now sits in one of our classrooms. It is engraved with *O'Brien Inter-house Debating Trophy*. See the picture at right. It must pre-date 1994, because she can't recall it being used in an official capacity during her time at Murrayville Community College.

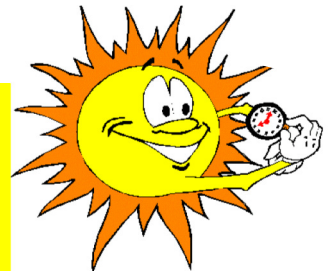
