### From the Principal

#### Questacon Visit –

We were very fortunate to have Questacon visit on Friday for a free hands on workshop for our students in Years 6-10. The workshop focussed on innovative design thinking, and equipping students with the confidence to test and refine ideas through hands-on digital and practical prototyping. Our students participated in the *Wind Tunnel Challenge* where the students were presented with the challenge of engineering an object using limited materials that will float in a wind tunnel for a minimum of 10 seconds. It took students through the innovation process of think, make, try and refine. This environment encouraged and allowed students to learn from their mistakes, which is integral and invaluable to the learning process as a whole. Scientific concepts such as air resistance and lift were also reinforced through the process.

#### Interschool Swimming –

A big congratulations to all of our students who competed at Ouyen last Friday. It was fantastic that MCC was declared the overall winning school. Special congratulations and good luck to those who have advanced to the next level to swim in the Sunraysia South Carnival on Thursday. Good luck to our secondary students who will be representing MMM (Murrayville, Managatang, Millewa) at the Mallee division swimming in Mildura tomorrow. Thank you to all of the parents who are supporting by attendance at these interschool events. Congratulations to Mr Willersdorf on his fantastic organisation of all of these events, February and March are very busy times for sports coordinators.

#### Attendance -

I have been recently reviewing our Attendance Policy and checking the School Attendance Guidelines. I thought it timely to remind parents that attendance at school is treated very seriously by the department and rightly so. Daily attendance at school is compulsory for all students aged 6-17.

Daily attendance is important for all

children and young people to succeed in education and to ensure they do not fall behind both socially and developmentally. School participation maximises life opportunities for children and young people by providing them with education and support networks. School helps people to develop important skills, knowledge and values that set them up for further learning and participation in their community. We are obligated to follow up any absences and there is a set of procedures to follow when unexplained absences accumulate.

We ask that parents contact reception either by email, SMS or phone on the day of an unplanned absence by 9.30am, after this time reception staff will follow up the absence by SMS or phone. Please provide a reason for the absence as the college is obligated to keep a record of the reason for the absence, given by the parent. I as principal must then determine whether this is a *'reasonable excuse'*. Illness, health appointments, bereavement are all examples of *'excused absences'*. Absences when attending a family holiday during school time is only marked as an *'excused absence'* when the parents have contacted the school in advance. Notes or messages that do not include a reason for the absence, mean the absence will be recorded as an *'unexcused absence'*. Five or more unexplained or unexcused absences is enough to trigger further procedures.

Please understand that our staff are only doing their job, when they are following up absences and are requesting a reason for the absence and are not attempting to pry or make judgement.

### Camps, Sports & Excursion Fund

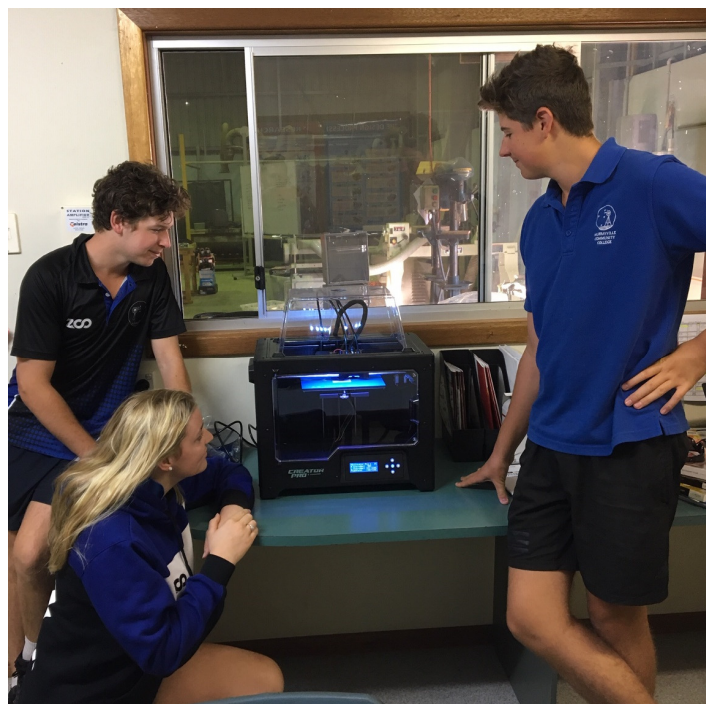

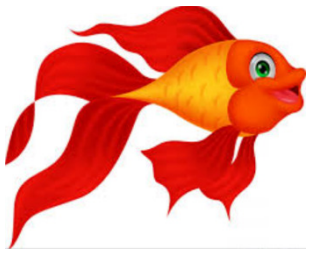

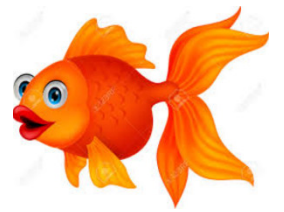

## Chaplaincy Matters

2019 is off and racing and it's great to be back at school. Here's to a positive and successful year for our school community.

Chaplaincy at MCC is again being offered in 2019. We would like to update you with days that we are available and to let you know what the Chaplaincy programme offers your school.

Chaplain Paul will be attending school on Tuesdays and Chaplain Barb on Thursdays, we will continue to do some volunteer days when possible and we look forward to attending school events together.

The role of a Chaplain in the school varies greatly, depending on needs that arise. We are here to support, in whatever way is needed. We work in a team setting to respond appropriately to needs that arise for students, families and the wider school community.

A "day in the life" of chaplaincy here at MCC can look like:

- ☺ individual appointments with students;
- ☺ working with the well-being team;
- ☺ class room visits;
- ☺ providing optional lunch and recess time activities;
- ☺ "well-being chats" in classrooms *or*
- ☺ running group work (eg Seasons for Growth, Shinegirl or Strength).

We value a pro-active approach to well-being, which is why we see great significance in group programmes. Our first priority is always immediate needs, which are unpredictable, so this is just a bit of a rough sketch!

Where individual appointments or group programmes are offered, students may only take part in these if written consent from parents is given. Many students have completed consent forms for Chaplaincy, signed by parents. These are held by the Chaplain and can be altered at any time by parents. When programmes are offered, a separate consent form is sent home for each of these. No consent form is required for class visits or recess and lunch time activities.

Our work as School Chaplains is always under the direction of our Principal, Mrs Mudie.

We would love to hear from you at any time during the year should you have any questions about chaplaincy or if we can help out in any way.

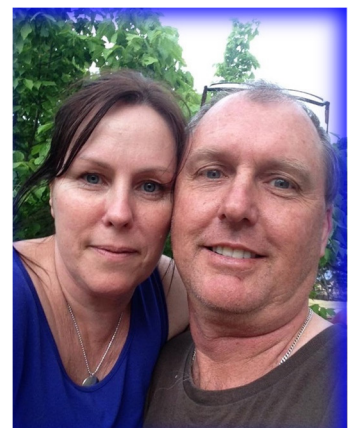

Matilda and Harvey have qualified for this stage with the times that they posted at the UDSSA event.

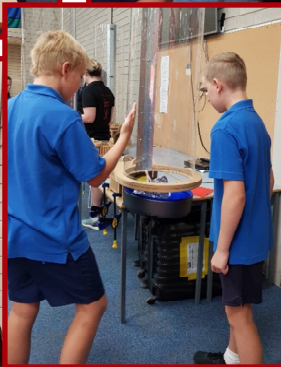
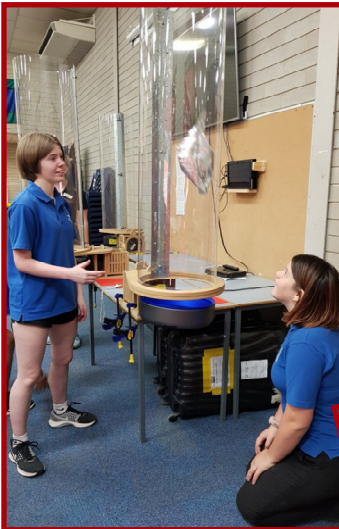
