From the Principal

### School Review –

Our Validation Day, the first part of the school review process, occurred on Wednesday.

The review panel which included our School Council President (Carly Heintze), the Reviewer John Hunter (past Principal), the Senior Education Improvement leader for northern Mallee (Andrew Ough), the Education Improvement leader for northern Mallee (Sommar Briggs) and Ouyen's Principal, Daniel Nemtsas, visited for the full day. They scrutinised the data from the past four years and our assessment against our previous Strategic Plan. They visited classrooms across the school and spoke briefly with students and teachers.

They commented on the fantastic vibe within the school and the fabulous learning culture that was evident in the classrooms they visited. Students were on task, they could clearly articulate how the task related to their learning goals. The reviewer was also very happy with our website as being very parent friendly and that all of the required policies were very well organised and accessible.

The second part of the review will be held in the 2<sup>nd</sup> week of Term 3, when the panel will talk more closely with students, staff and parents about how the school can further improve and where our priorities need to be for our next four year Strategic Plan. **Please note the 24<sup>th</sup> & 25<sup>th</sup> of July on your calendar if you would like to have input into this very important process.**

### School Wide Positive Behaviour Support –

Last week our students had input into the SWPBS posters that are going up in classrooms this week. These posters remind students what is required "To be a learner, To be respectful and To be safe" in individual classroom settings.

I thank them for their input into this task. P-6 students have been invited to contribute to their posters via a picture competition. The P-6 posters will be updated for next term with the winning designs. It has been great to see so many acknowledgements of positive behaviours and so very few minor incidents. It makes my job as Principal so much easier and makes our school a positive and friendly learning environment.

### Reconciliation Week –

This week is Reconciliation Week, and the theme is "Grounded in truth – Walk together with courage". To mark this event Mrs Finn has created an activity that students will complete in either Art or Home group classes, where they will decorate a footprint to create a symbolic display of "walking together with courage".

### Youth Ambassadors –

Jade Bennier is participating in the Statewide Youth Ambassadors program again this week. A big part of their program is discussing the "Rural Inspire" project that was promised massive federal funding if the Coalition were returned. They are also presenting to the Deputy Secretary of Education, Katy Haire about post-compulsory learning options for rural and remote young people and potential pathway options after finishing school. This is a fantastic leadership development opportunity for Jade.

## School Wide Positive Behaviour Support

The students at MCC have been involved in creating our school wide behaviour expectations under the three key areas of 'Be a Learner', 'Be Respectful' and 'Be Safe', which tie in with our school values of PRIDE. The SRC in the primary school ran sessions in classrooms about the expectations, giving students voice around what they are, and how they should be worded on the primary posters. They also ran scenarios at assembly to show students what these expectations would look like. The primary students now have the opportunity to be involved in designing a piece of art work that will be displayed on the MCC Primary SWPBS posters. The high school students gathered together on Friday afternoon and had a similar session to discuss the behaviour expectations for the high school and how they would like their expectations worded and displayed. Students had great discussions amongst themselves and with teachers about what they want to see as expectations and voiced their opinions around the posters that will feature in the high school. It has been a really positive start to the year with the SWPBS team running PD with staff, collecting data on student's behaviour to monitor trends and patterns around positive choices and students having input into the behavioural expectations at MCC.
