From the Principal

Uniform –

With the wintery weather and short days it is difficult to keep up with clean uniform. We have recently noticed that there are some variations (especially pants) to secondary uniform, that are not consistent with the dress code outlined in the uniform policy. This time last year our uniform was relaxed to a significant degree, to give students and families the best opportunity to meet guidelines and to keep students warm and comfortable. The students were involved in the decisions made by uniform committee and when we have been involved with discussions at Youth Ambassadors it is clear that our students have had more say in the composition of the uniform than those in many other schools.

- The sports hoodie with white logo and trim will now be an option as part of the general uniform and can be worn at any time.
- Pants and shorts can be either grey or navy, **not black**. Pants need to be plain without trims, tabs or **elasticated cuffs**, but may have a small logo (6cm diameter or less). Shorts need to be mid-thigh or school issue.
- Socks may be white, navy, grey or black and may have a small logo.
- Shoes must be mainly black and not have bright coloured trims or laces.
- Students may now wear nail polish that is in neutral tones, light pink, beige or French (no bright nail polish).
- No football shorts or football socks are to be worn for interschool sport competitions.

The dress code outlined in the uniform policy is an expectation for secondary students. Primary students are strongly encouraged to wear options from the approved uniform list but there is not the same expectation. For example, it is perfectly fine for Primary students to wear tracksuit pants with elasticated cuffs, bright shoes and coloured socks. Please refer to the full uniform policy on the website and contact the school if you are unsure. The majority of the uniform is available through the front office. If you are purchasing tracksuit pants in the holidays for your child to wear to school, please ensure that they are navy or grey and do not have an elasticated cuff on the bottom.

Year 10 Work Experience -

It gives students a first-hand experience at undertaking some of the tasks expected in that career and observing others. 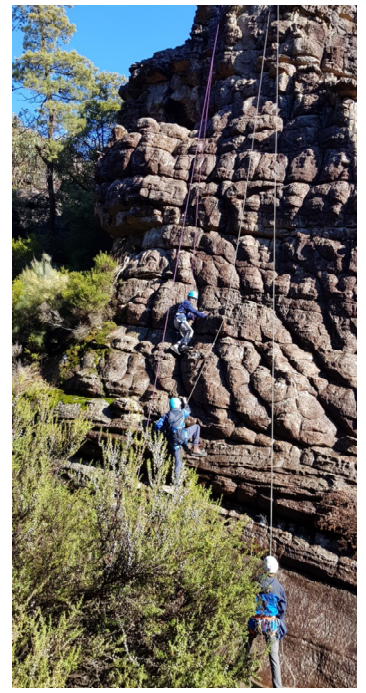
