Athletics Success –

Congratulations to all of our age group champions and to Matilda for achieving 21 points. A large number of students have qualified for the next level of competition. Good luck to Matilda and Harvey who will compete at Sunraysia South tomorrow, and all of our secondary students who have qualified for Regional athletics at Bendigo next term.

P-6 Arts Centre trip –

On Wednesday our whole primary will travel to the Mildura Arts Centre for a performance of Roald Dahl's 'Revolting Rhymes'. I am sure that all our students will have a fantastic day. The 2/3/4 students are also participating in some environmental awareness and sustainability activities and staying overnight at Lake Cullulleraine, as this will be their year level camp.

Maintenance Blitz –

Last week you may have heard through the media that Victorian schools are sharing in \$515 million to maintain and modernise our infrastructure. Murrayville Community College has been allocated \$196,654 to be spent by the end of 2020, this will enable us to complete some of the minor works programs that have been on our to do list for some time and to get some things ticked off our wish-list that we could not normally afford.

Women in School Leadership –

It is now less than a week until I depart for India and this exciting development opportunity. I thought I would share a very condensed version of some of the things I will be doing, for your interest:

Day 1: Arrival with 5 other Victorian Women Principals, Orientation in Delhi, Showcase event in the evening with Deputy Victorian Premier & Victorian Minister for Education

Day 2: Meet with Delhi Female Principals to discuss key issues in Delhi and Victorian School Education



Day 3: Visiting Non-Government organisations to understand Delhi's social context and youth issues

Days 4 - 7: Homestay with Dr Meenaskshi Gupta, and visit to SD Public school (2300 students) to carry out school based inquiry program. I will be looking at gender equity and how their school creates a culture of aspiration for girls.

Day 8: Exploring the history & culture of India & presentation from Dr Mohanty (spaceship designer)

Day 9: Victorian Principals including me, will prepare and present our presentations about our learnings and the project

Day 10: Departure

This is a fantastic opportunity personally for me and I look forward to sharing my learnings with the staff and students upon my return. Consequently this is my last newsletter for the term. I would like to wish everyone an enjoyable break during the holidays and look forward to seeing everyone on Monday 7th of October.

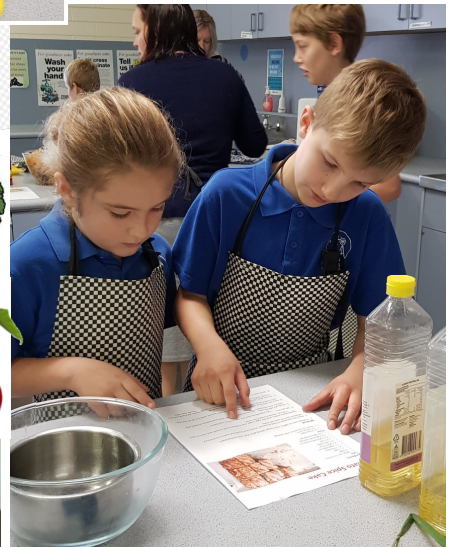
FATHER'S DAY CELEBRATIONS WITH P-6 DADS AT MCC
