From the Principal

Welcome back -

- Mrs Beckmann is taking some medical leave from the beginning of next week and Mr Watson and Mrs Parker will be sharing the teaching of the 5/6 class.
- We have also welcomed 2 student teachers for the first half of the semester. Jessica Allan is on placement in the P-1 room everyday for the next four weeks and Skye Schueller will be in our Year 2,3,4 class on Tuesdays and Thursdays.

Lunchtime Netball -

I am pleased to announce that we have a lunchtime netball program commencing for our students from this week. Given that most of our students are unable to participate in community netball this season, Stacey Morzer-Bruyns has organised a session for senior students (Years 6-12) on Tuesdays and Years P-5 on Wednesdays. Mrs Chaplin is going to assist with the junior session and a number of our senior students are also helping out as part of their Duke of Ed volunteering. Thank you to all of these ladies for providing this opportunity for our students to be active, improve their skills and have some fun.

Covid-19 - (This information is repeated from Wednesday's parent email)

I want to assure all parents that we are still being extremely vigilant around our processes and protocols for preventing the spread of Covid-19. The school continues to undergo additional cleaning each day and hand hygiene protocols are enforced. We are not holding assemblies and have cancelled the Year 10 Cluster camp to Bogong and the snow. We cannot welcome parents and visitors into the school in volunteering roles and ask that parents and carers do not congregate during drop off and pick up. Athletics Sports will be held in the last weeks of term, but with students and staff only and in stages rather than all on the one day. We will continue to celebrate our students' achievements on our Facebook page.

The level of community transmission of Covid-19 in Victoria is concerning and although the vast majority of the cases are presenting in Greater Melbourne there are now some cases appearing in regional Victoria & NSW. It is imperative that students stay home if they are unwell and if they become unwell at school they will be sent home. It is important that unwell students who have any of the Covid-19 symptoms (however mild) do now get a Covid-19 test and remain at home until they receive a negative result. This test can be done locally, but you should advise the receptionist when making the appointment that your child is requiring a Covid test.

The most common symptoms of Covid-19 are:

- Fever
- Chills or sweats
- Cough

- Sore throat
- Shortness of breath
- Runny nose or loss of sense of smell

We all have our fingers crossed that the lockdown measures in Melbourne soon start to have a positive impact on case numbers and we can again look forward to welcoming parents and carers back into school.


